“Let’s Go to the Movies” —Film Synopses

The Aviator (2004) Dir: Martin Scorsese

Tycoon Howard Hughes is a successful director of big-budget Hollywood films, a passionate lover of Hollywood's leading ladies, and an aviation pioneer. But in private, he suffers from paralyzing phobias and depression. The higher he rises, the farther he has to fall. Starring Leonardo de Caprio and Cate Blanchett.

A Man Called Ove (2015) Dir: Hannes Holm

Ove, an ill-tempered, isolated retiree who spends his days enforcing block association rules and visiting his wife's grave, has finally given up on life just as an unlikely friendship develops with his boisterous new neighbors. Starring Rolf Lassgård and Bahar Pars.

It's a Wonderful Life (1946) Dir: Frank Capra

An angel is sent from Heaven to help a desperately frustrated businessman by showing him what life would have been like if he had never existed. Starring James Stewart and Donna Reed.

Waking Ned Devine (1998) Dir: Kirk Jones

When word reaches two elderly best friends that someone in their village has won the Irish National Lottery, they plot to discover the identity of the winner. Starring Ian Bannen and David Kelly.

Dial M for Murder (1954) Dir: Alfred Hitchcock

An ex-tennis pro carries out a plot to murder his wife. When things go wrong, he improvises a brilliant Plan B. Starring Ray Milland and Grace Kelly.

The Fall (2006) Dir: Tarse Singh

In a hospital on the outskirts of 1920s Los Angeles, an injured stuntman tells a fellow patient, a little girl with a broken arm, a fantastic story of five mythical heroes.
